This photograph of Nightingale was taken at her home in South Street, in 1910. It is thought to be the last photograph taken of her. Lizzie Caswall Smith, a noted female photographer of the era captured the image and it is understood to be the only photographic session she conducted outside her studio, where other subjects included suffragettes Millicent Fawcett and Christabel Pankhurst.

As Nightingale reached the end of her life we know from her letters that she reflected upon who she met, what she achieved, and what her legacy would be. THE NIGHTINGALE FUND.

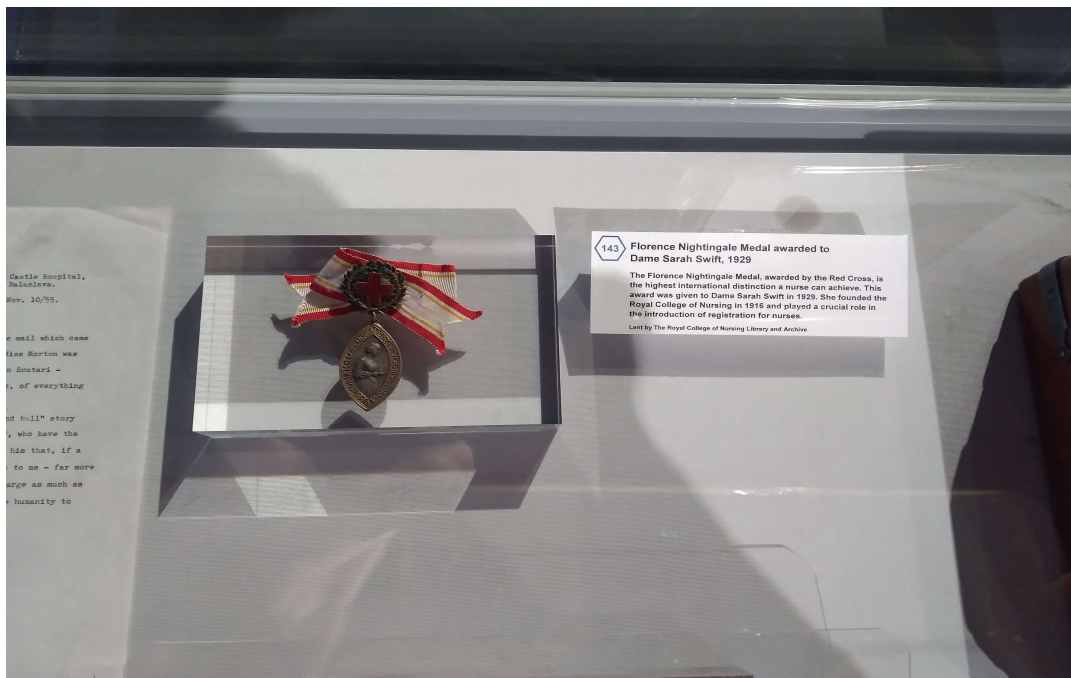
THE signal services rendered by Miss NIGHTINGALE to the sick and wounded of the British Forces in the East, have excited throughout the Country a universal desire to testify by some marked and substantial acknowledgment, the gratitude and admiration of the British people.

But Miss NIGHTINGALE has nobly refused to accept any testimonial from which she could derive personal advantage of any description: while it is ascertained that the tribute most in harmony with her feelings and wishes, would be to afford further scope for her disinterested exertions by placing under her immediate superintendence the establishment of an Institution for the reception, protection, and training, of Hospital Nurses and Assistants, the inestimable blessings of the system she has introduced, may be extended generally to the Poor, who may be suffering from any accident.

For this object a public appeal has been made, to which the noble, generous, and the benevolent, have liberally responded. But it is felt, that it should not be denied to any class to manifest the sympathy all should entertain towards their devoted and high-minded Countrywomen. In situations, however small, of those who are dependent upon their benefactors, have a peculiar fitness when given for an object by which the poor are to be exclusively benefited; while it is certain the widow's mite have equal value in the estimation of Miss NIGHTINGALE, with the gifts of the great and the affluent.

According to these views, the Proprietors of this Establishment have given for a Subscription Book to be opened in the Conning House contributions however small, will be received and recorded; and collected will be transmitted to the Committee and advertised as donations of the Workmen and others in this Establishment.
