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#### **ABOUT ESAG**

The Centro de Ciências da Administração e Socioeconômicas or ESAG, is a part of the Santa Catarina State University, that has 5 centers in Florianópolis; The College of Social-Economic and Administration sciences gathers the Public Administration, Business Management and Economics majors.

#### The "Buddy" Program

Just like this guide, to help you navigate life at UDESC and Florianópolis, the University has what is called the "Buddy Program". The program consists of a UDESC student volunteering to help you with the most importants tasks when you first arrive in Florianópolis: helping you to find a place to stay in your first week, explain how UDESC and ESAG works and just helping with common questions you may have during your exchange.

## AT ESAG WE HAVE MULTIPLE STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS:



The Student Directory, O Diretório Acadêmico,

The *Diretório Acadêmico de Administração* e *Gerência* – DAAG – was created with the first class at ESAG, in 1966. It's the student organization that represents and gives voice to the students at our school, including the international students! The Directory organizes events, supports students and exchange students at ESAG, and community service projects.



The Atlética da ESAG, ESAG's varsity

ESAG's varsity is called "Atlética da ESAG", another student organization that works under three pillars: gathering, sports and representativity. The Atlética da ESAG organizes the major parties - like events at our school, at the same time managing the different sports teams that represent ESAG.







#### The Academic Centers: CADE, CAEMP and CACIJ

This kind of student organization depends on your major: CAEMP is a center that represents the Business Management majors, CACIJ represents and gathers the Public Administration majors and CADE represents the economics majors. If you need any specific information about a major, you can ask its Academic Center.



#### The Finance Club,

The Finance Club is a student league organization focused on the financial market, organized by UDESC and UFSC (Santa Catarina's Federal University) students, the two public universities in Florianópolis. The club competes in tournaments and organizes training programs for its members.



#### **ENACTUS**

ENACTUS is an international social entrepreneurship organization, present in more than 37 countries around the world, working on community service projects. You can get involved in its social entrepreneurship projects, just contact our International Relations Advisor and we'll put you in contact with our friends at ENACTUS-ESAG.



#### ESAG Jr.

ESAG Júnior is a college company in consulting, it provides service to companies in both private and public sectors, ESAG Jr accepts members from all three majors at our school. You can learn a lot about the brazilian market talking with ESAG Jr's members.

## ESAG's INFRASTRUCTURE

ESAG has multiple laboratories equipped with computers, they are open to ESAG students during the class period (8am to 10:30pm), it is not necessary to make reservations and the laboratories are located right in front of the main stairway at ESAG.

DAAG has an office, where you can lay back and relax a bit, talk to other students and DAAG members, this office is located to the right of the cafeteria.

To access ESAG's Wi-Fi you just need your SIGA account, you can choose between two networks:

eduroam password: yourpassword

WL-udesc password: vourpassword



UDESC has a library that is available for students and it's really close to ESAG, the BU (Biblioteca Universitária) is a great place to look for books, do assignments and even relax in a quieter place.

The BU sign up process is made automatically for student, you just need your ID Udesc and password, which is given to you by the SCII (Center for Interinstitutional and International Cooperation) at your welcoming meeting.

You can check out the library's available books in person or through the <u>website</u> biblioteca universitária udesc > guia do usuário > consulta ao acervo.



UDESC also has a restaurant called RU (Restaurante Universitário), that opens from monday to friday and serves lunch. the prices are R\$ 4,50 for students and R\$ 9 for members of the community, so if you're ever hungry, the RU is open from 11am to 2pm.

## UTILITIES NEARBY

Our school is very well located, at the Madre Benvenuta avenue, it has an extensive variety of different restaurants, stores, supermarkets and ATMs. Here are a few recommendations we have for you:

- Food (Burguer King, McDonalds, Subway, Starbucks, restaurantes)

- Meu Escritório Bar 2 ou ME2(the closest bar to ESAG after Didicos, we usually prefer to go there because it's closer)

#### Portuguese classes

Both UFSC and UDESC offer portuguese classes to international students, at UDESC the College of Education and Human Sciences (FAED) offers this course for free, following this link.

If you live closer to UFSC you can also choose to take the portuguese classes over there, at the College of International Literature and Languages (at CCE) following this link.





### **TRANSPORTATION**

Transportation in Florianópolis (for those who don't have a driver's licence) can be summed up into three alternatives:

- Apps (Uber, 99, Blablacar)
- Public transportation, the bus
- Lifts, "Carona Solidária" (WhatsApp group)

The bus stops at terminals and bus stops, right in front of UDESC we have two, one for each direction of the avenue.

The name of the bus is presented like this: line number - where it goes or where it passes by or terminal.



Example:

233 - TICAN - TITRI via UFSC

This bus goes from TICAN or TITRI (two different terminals) to the other terminal, passing by UFSC.



We recommend the app and website <u>floripanoponto</u>, where you can easily find the bus you need to get where you want to go. All lines make round trips, so if you need to go the other way, you can just cross the street and get the bus from the other direction.



Once you are in floripanoponto, you can click "previsão de embarque" and write UDESC as a reference point. The website/app is going to show you all the bus lines that pass by UDESC.

To apply for a student's bus card, you'll need a document called "Comprovante de Matrícula", basically the proof of enrollment document. In order to get the document, you'll have to go to ESAG's administration office, at your right when you enter ESAG, once you're there it's easy, just ask for your Comprovante de Matrícula.

Important to note - there are different types of bus:

D = direct bus, doesn't stop at bus stops. Executivo = executive class bus, a bit more expensive but has air conditioning and better seats.

Carona Solidária are groups on WhatsApp where you can ask/offer lifts for other students, it's a really fun and green way to move around Florianópolis. If you are interested, please contact our International Relations Advisor and we'll put you in the WhatsApp group.

## HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

Now, this is the section of the Exchange Student's Guide we wish we never need, but here we are going to show you how to proceed if something bad happens or if you're just not feeling good.

If you need medicines, you can always go to the pharmacy the closest to you, here are the name of a few so you can look it up on the internet:

- Droga Raia;
- Farmácia Popular;
- Panvel;
- Pague Menos.

All of these are located at the Madre Benvenuta Avenue and Villa Romana mall. Pharmacies here are just like anywhere else in the world, you can buy shampoo, soap, medicines and well-being products.

In Florianópolis, the Emergency Rooms are called "Unidade de Pronto Atendimento" (UPA), so if your health concern is urgent, you can call the number 192 to call an ambulance, a free public service in Brazil, or ask someone you know to take you there. In Florianópolis we have multiple UPAs, one for each region of the city. The closest UPA to ESAG would be "UPA Continente", but you can also go to the UFSC's hospital, HU, which is much closer.



You can also go to public or private hospitals to seek help, the only difference is that if you go to private owned hospitals, you'll have to pay for you treatment. Here are the name of a few hospitals in Florianópolis: Baía Sul (private), Unimed (private), Hospital de Caridade (public/private) and HU (UFSC's hospital, public)

You most certainly have health insurance, since you got a student visa in Brazil, so please be informed about what services it covers, if you need any help getting that information, please contact the Secretaria de Cooperação Internacional or our International Relations Advisor.

If your health concern is not urgent, you can both schedule a private doctor's appointment or go to a "Centro de Saúde", where you can schedule blood tests, an appointment with every type of doctor you need, and many other things.

#### To sum up:

- UPAs are the brazilian public health emergency rooms (that are actually buildings);
- Florianópolis has public and private hospitals;
- Pharmacies work just like in any other country in the world;
  - At Centros de Saúde you can schedule doctor appointments and clinical tests;

### HOUSING

A good housing situation is an essential part of an exchange program, so in this topic we are going to help you get a great place to stay in Florianopolis.

Before showing you where you can find apartments, there are a few expressions you should know before looking for a place to stay:

- Para locação = for rent
- Studio = small apartment, usually between 23 m<sup>2</sup> and 35 m<sup>2</sup>.
- Apto = short for apartment (apartamento)
- Kitnet or quitinete = a compact form of a flat, usually it doesn't have many room separations, so you'll find a kitchen/dinning room.




University students usually offer a single bedroom as an offer to share an apartment, they'll specify that by writing "quarto vago".



You probably want to live closer to ESAG, so you are gonna be looking for an apartment at the Santa Monica region (Santa Monica, Trindade, Itacorubi)

## FREE TIME ACTIVITIES

In this topic we are going to show you how fun Florianópolis really is, recommending cool activities to do in your free time.

#### Hiking

Florianópolis has plenty of beautiful nature-related activities, there are a lot of awesome hiking spots for you to explore Florianópolis outside of the city, here are some examples so you can look up other "trilhas".

Be cautious when choosing a hike, look up reviews and ask our international relations advisor for tips, some hikes are very hard and even dangerous, we also recommend this <u>website</u> to look for hikes and detailed information about them.

#### **Movies**

Here in Brazil the movie theatres are generally located inside shopping malls, such as Villa Romana and Beiramar, so you will always find a cinema in those. The movies are screened in dublado (portuguese audio with no subtitles) and legendado (original audio with subtitles in portuguese), here are a few names of great movie theatres:

- Cinesystem (Villa Romana Shopping)

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- Paradigma Cinearte
- Cinemark (Floripa Shopping)

#### **Parties**

To complete the undergrad student life in Florianópolis, we couldn't forget to mention the "festas universitárias", or university parties. They are great events to have, make new friends and get to know the brazilian songs students like.

Most of the well-known parties in Florianópolis are organized by UFSC's students, the tickets are often sold at the university campus or online and almost every major has its own party, you can always ask our international relations advisor for help too. Here are a few of the most famous "festas universitárias":

- Betonada (organized by Civil Engineering UFSC)
- Choppada (organized by Atlética da ESAG)
- Amnésia (Organized by CS and Design UFSC)

#### **Theatre and Concerts**

- Parador P12 (past concerts: David Guetta, Alok, Nando Reis)
- Stage Music Park (past concerts: Slash, KevinoChris, Annita)
- Arena Petry (past concerts: Coldplay, Skank)

#### **Sightseeing**

There are a lot of beautiful places in Florianópolis to explore, and you can visit all of them by bus! We recommend visiting the traditional neighbourhoods in the island, there you can read about the history of our city in museums and try the local cuisine. Here is a lot of list of neighbourhoods where you can get easily by bus:

- Cacupé




#### The Santa Catarina coast
